FINAL PREVIEW — Tie to be played at Wembley Stadium, March 28th, 2010

Managers relishing Wembley date

Southampton boss Alan Pardew and Carlisle counterpart Greg Abbott agree it will be one of the proudest moments of their careers when they lead out their respective clubs in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final at Wembley.

But pride on the day and a combative edge is all these two fiercely competitive managers are likely to share as they plot each other's downfall in a showpiece final that is gathering credence year-on-year among the footballing fraternity.

Pardew's Saints booked their Wembley date with a 3-1 win over MK Dons in the second leg of their Southern Area Final in front of a 30,000-crowd at St Mary's Stadium.

Abbott's side did it the hard way, overcoming Leeds 6-5 on penalties at a sold-out Brunton Park in the second leg of a nerve-jangling Northern Area Final.

Former Reading, West Ham and Charlton boss Pardew said: "I will be very proud because this is a big club. It was a special night (against MK Dons) and I didn't think a night like that would come so soon in the season."

"The fans were brilliant for us and they deserve their day out at Wembley, as do the players."

"They have worked incredibly hard in this competition, never mind about any other competition, to get to the final."

"The main focus in the dressing room was to give the fans something here."

"We've managed to do that, so I'm pleased for them and pleased for the owner and chairman because they also deserve it."

Abbott, who never made it to Wembley in over

500 appearances as a professional player, admitted: "It means everything for me and (first-team coach) Dennis (Booth) to be taking a club that has looked after us to Wembley."

"We have tried to look after it and there are some great people here. We've tried to unite the whole club and there is a real sense of enthusiasm running through the place."

"Everyone is working towards the same thing and to go to what I call the mecca of football will be really special."

"This is the proudest moment of my career so far and I think that taking the team there on the day will make me feel even more proud."

"I didn't even get close as a player. I walked past it a few times, but I was never invited in, so this is a great achievement for the club. Everyone should feel really proud."

Price tells Carlisle: 'go and do a Donny'

Carlisle United loan star Jason Price has told his team-mates to 'do a Donny' by emulating his former club to win the Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

The Welshman starred for Rovers en-route to victory in the first ever Johnstone's Paint Trophy final in 2007, and has challenged his current club to repeat the feat at Wembley on Sunday.

Price, who scored on his debut for the Cumbrians, will not be eligible for the eagerly anticipated clash with Southampton, but is using his past experience to spur his side on.

He said: "Winning the trophy with Doncaster was a great experience for everyone. It brought a lot of money to the club and it was a great day out for the players."

"When the national anthem began, the hairs really stood up on the back of my neck. You knew you were going to be part of a special day."

"I'd just tell the Carlisle boys to go for it and seize the opportunity, because it is a wonderful occasion and a brilliant competition. I wish I was playing myself."

Price is enjoying his time at Carlisle after arriving on loan from Millwall – despite the lengthy trek up the M6 to get there.

"It must be about 400 miles up here! I like it in Carlisle, it reminds me of home."

"I had a walk round the town centre the other day and told my mum it was like being back in Wales, without her being there!"

Price will not be at Wembley to watch the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final, and admits this season's trophy campaign hasn't been as memorable for him personally.

He added: "I haven't had a great time in this season's trophy. We (Millwall) lost in the first round to Barnet 2-0, I pulled a hamstring and we all got a ticking off from the manager."

"So it's funny that I'm now with a club which is in the final. I won't be watching at Wembley though, as I hate being a spectator when I can't play."

"But the lads know I'll be rooting them on and I really hope they lift the trophy like we did at Doncaster in 2007."



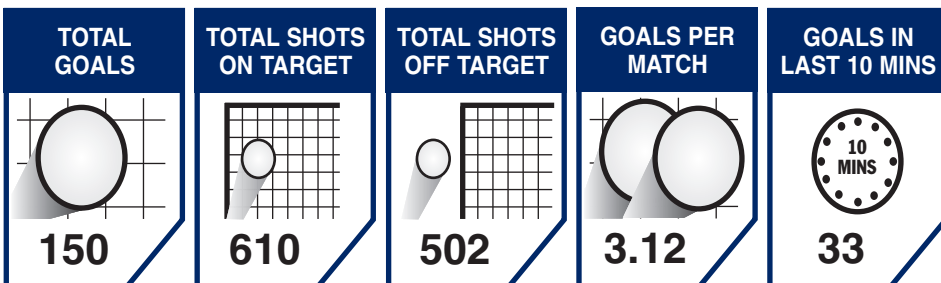

Finalists do it the hard way

Carlisle and Southampton will contest the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final at Wembley after battling through arguably the toughest field in the competition's history.

Southampton were one of four recent Premier League clubs in this year's competition with Leeds, Charlton and Norwich also competing for the coveted prize.

The first round saw a shock in the Southern Section as League Two side Barnet knocked out League One Millwall with a 2-0 victory at Underhill.

In the Northern Section Burton were given a harsh lesson on their JPT debut as they were beaten 5-1 by Chesterfield, while Carlisle required penalties to see off Morecambe.

Having received a bye in the first round, Southampton began their road to Wembley in the Southern Section second round with a home tie against League Two new-boys Torquay.

Despite being massive favourites for the tie, Alan Pardew's men came close to being knocked out and had to battle back from 2-0 down to secure a 2-2 draw in normal time before holding their nerve to triumph on penalties.

Barnet were unable to repeat their first-round heroics as they were beaten 4-1 by Charlton at The Valley.

There was a shock in the Northern Section with Grimsby knocking out League One side Hartlepool, while Scott Dobie scored twice to give Carlisle a 4-2 win over Macclesfield at Brunton Park.

The glamour tie of the quarter-finals saw Southampton drawn against another one of the favourites in Charlton.

However, unlike the previous round, the Saints made lighter work of their opponents and ran out 2-0 winners at St Mary's.

Leeds continued their steady passage through the Northern Section with a comfortable 3-1 win over Grimsby at Elland Road, while Carlisle also ran out 3-1 winners at Chesterfield.

Southampton's route to the final did not get any easier with a visit of League One promotion hopefuls Norwich in the Southern Area semi-finals.

After a 2-2 draw in normal time, Southampton held their nerve once again to triumph 6-5 on penalties.

In the other semi, MK Dons brought Hereford's good run in the competition to an end with a 4-1 victory and in the Northern Section Leeds swept past League Two side Accrington 2-0.

Carlisle secured their place in the Northern Area final against Leeds with a 3-0 win over Bradford.

The Cumbrians went into the clash with Leeds as underdogs but Joe Anyinsah's late strike gave them a 2-1 win at Elland Road in the first leg.

As expected Leeds came roaring back in the second leg and ran out 3-2 winners in normal time to level the tie but Shane Lowry's miss in the penalty shootout meant Carlisle triumphed 6-5.

Paul Ince led MK Dons to victory in the JPT in 2008 but was unable to mastermind another return to Wembley this season as Southampton won both legs on their Southern Area final.

The Saint ran out 3-1 winners at St Mary's in the first leg before winning 1-0 at stadium:mk to seal their place in the showpiece.

Johnstone's Paint Trophy Facts

A total of **48** games have been played in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy this season with the home side winning **30** matches (62%) and the away team being victorious **18** times (38%). **33** matches (69%) have reached a conclusion in 90 minutes, whilst **15** (31%) have been settled on penalties.

There have been **1112** shots, goals constitute **13.5%** of all shots (doesn't include own goals).

The woodwork came to the rescue of the defending side on **23** occasions (the biggest beneficiaries being Milton Keynes Dons **3**). In regulation play there have been **9** penalties awarded and of those **7** were scored (a success rate of 77.8%). Northampton have been awarded most penalties - **2**. Northampton have given most penalties away **3**.
